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### Law Tuition Approach

In my opinion, it is of primary importance that each tutorial is tailored to the needs of the individual student, as such tailoring ensures that the sessions will give the student the best opportunity to be a competitive university applicant. To that end, my sessions are based around detailed discussion with each student about exactly what they want to achieve through the sessions. In order to boost the efficacy of the sessions, I will often supplement the hour-long session with extra work to be completed and returned between the tutorials.

During sessions focused on preparing for interview, my own preference is to split the session, usually in half, so that the first part is a mock interview. This is followed by a feedback and advice session. I find that this structure facilitates the development of better interview technique, as practice is absolutely vital to Law interview preparation.
